SCOUT NEWS

Ukraine/Artek 1990 continued;

The weeks that passed at Artek were very interesting, while the activities were mostely centered around the Beach, Games and Discos we seen a side of the U.S.S.R. ordinary Tourists never see. We had unrestricted travel to towns and cities. The travel to those centres, Yalta and Gonzuf was mainly by public transport which was cheap and efficient, we also travelled a lot by Taxi which was also very inexpensive. The stocks in the shops were very Timited by our standards. The main critisisms we heard from the Soviets were of the lack of consumer goods and the supply and distribution of basic food stuffs, for example bananas had not been in stock for over 3 months. Against that they were amazed that we had to pay dearly for glasses and contact lenses while theirs are supplied free of charge. Gorbachev was very unpopular as was his wife Raisa, our contacts said that even under the now discredited Brezhnov Government items were never in such short supply. Most of the people we met had a pessimistic view on the future of their society they reckoned that it would end up messy and worse of all, bloody, While we were there the Ukraine actually declared independance, most people seemed disinterested though. The Durrow contingent contingent seemed to be a very popular group. A lot of people remarked to me that they were the friendliest group there as they always seemed to have a smile on their faces-maybe there is a story behind the smiles? We also had our fair share of successes at Artek, during the first week there a singing contest was arranged and true to form we beat the Americans, British, Soviets, Czechslovaks and Mexicans with a spirited rendition of "Molly Malone" and a hilarious version of "It's a Long Way to Tipperary" during which most of us were falling around in spasms of laughter. Seemingly it impressed the judges as we were awarded the first place medals at the end of the night, incidently there were over thirty entries in the competition. We also scored on the Soccer Field, our sub-camp won the inter-Artek Football Championship and on that team were David O'Flanagan and Ray O'Sullivan. Both of them had excellent games in the final with David being the man of the match with two well taken goals in a 3 - 1 win. One of the goals was a beauty from a free kick - more medals to the Irish.

On a more serious note, after our National Day which we started with FTagbreak, renewed our Scout Promise and said a short prayer. The sub-camp Chief Victor told me that 3 years ago he would have lost his job if the same opening ceremony had taken place, so changing times indeed in the Soviet Union. We arranged to have Mass said on the Camp with the aid of a Maltese Priest who was Ordained in Ireland. I had met him at a meeting of leaders of the foreign delegations early the first week. At Mass the congregation was mainly Irish, Maltese, Polish, English and American but we were amazed at the numbers of young Soviets who said that they were Christian or else intended to become Christian. I also met a Russian Orthodox Priest who said that they were going to request the opening of an official Church on the Camp.
